2023 LAW DAY STUDENT COMPETITION
(GRADES 6-12)**

Dear Educator:

Our annual **Law Day celebration** is almost here! As you may know, every year the Polk County Bar Association (PCBA) sponsors educational activities and a competition for your students in honor of national Law Day. This is an opportunity for your students to showcase their creative talents, learn about important issues relating to the law, and **win prizes!** This year's competition will include visual arts, music and performing arts, essay, technology, and poetry categories for 6th through 12th grade students in Polk County. You will also have a chance to win a prize based on **best classroom participation**, so consider getting your students involved today!

What is Law Day?

Law Day is recognized annually on May 1 as a national day of celebration aimed to strengthen the American heritage of liberty, justice, and equality under the law. Each year the American Bar Association chooses a theme for Law Day to help foster education and a deeper understanding of the legal system. **This year's theme is: "Cornerstones of Democracy – Civics, Civility, and Collaboration" Focus on rebuilding trust in our institutions, respect for one another, and our willingness to collaborate to address the challenges that face our nation.**

Why Should Your Students Participate?

- Your students learn more about the law and our legal system.
- Curriculum opportunity for you –
 - We would be happy to talk with your students about Law Day and this year's theme. The discussion can either be in-person or via video conferencing – whatever works best for your classroom!
- Fun competition with great prizes!
- Opportunity for your students to meet judges and attorneys in Polk County.
- All winning entries will be displayed on the PCBA website.
- If you get the most students to participate, you could also win a prize for your classroom!

How is the Competition Judged?

- Judges will be looking for creative expression that demonstrates understanding of the theme and its main concepts – the expression can be curious, critical, serious, or humorous.
- Entries are judged by attorneys and judges and the PCBA Law Day Committee in Polk County.
- The entries will be judged in two classes: (1) Grades 6, 7, and 8; and (2) Grades 9, 10, 11, and 12. Each category will be evaluated separately.

Winners will be honored at the PCBA Law Day Awards Celebration on **May 1, 2023**. We will notify you of the winners and provide more information about the celebration at that time.

What Are the Types of Entries?

- **Visual Arts entries** must include: **(Group projects allowed, but prize would be shared)**
 - A title, and
 - Short description of how the entry relates to the theme.
 - Visual Arts may be submitted in the form of any original two or three-dimensional medium, including painting, sculpture, graphic design and photography.
 - Must be able to take a photo or a short video of the entry that can be emailed (lawday@pcbaonline.org) for judging.
 - Winners will have arrangements made for pick up or drop off of their submission
- **Poetry entries - (Individual project only)**

- May be in the form of any traditionally recognized form: epic, blank verse, sonnets, haiku, etc.
- Consider use of figurative language, imagery, pun, oxymoron, and personification.
- One-page limit.
- Must email submission to (lawday@pcbaonline.org) for judging
- **Music and Performing Arts** may be: **(Group projects allowed, but prize would be shared)**
 - In the form of:
 - An **original** musical composition (lyrics must be original, but precomposed melodies and background music are permissible) recorded in the following playable formats: YouTube or Windows Media Player. YouTube is preferred; **OR**
 - An **original** video production, such as a documentary or original drama recorded in the following formats: YouTube or Windows Media Player. YouTube is preferred.
 - Your entry may be shorter than 3 minutes in length, but should not be longer than 3 minutes.
 - All video and audio entries must be submitted via a link such as YouTube or reviewable with Windows Media Player to lawday@pcbaonline.org
- **Essay entries (Individual project only)**
 - All essays should be between 200 and 500 words and either typed or hand written with standard formatting.
 - Must be emailed (lawday@pcbaonline.org) to be judged
- **Technology entries** must include: **(Group projects allowed, but prize would be shared)**
 - A title, and
 - Short description of how the entry relates to the theme.
 - Your entry may be shorter than 5 minutes in length, but should not be longer than 5 minutes.
 - Any video and audio entries must be submitted and playable on YouTube or Windows Media Player. This also includes a platform to view any informational or game apps created.
 - All entries must be submitted by email to lawday@pcbaonline.org

What Else Do We Need to Know About the Competition?

- All entries must reflect the student's view or understanding of the theme.
- All entries must include a completed entry form and release of liability form below.
 - **Each entry must be signed by the student and include the release form.**
 - **A parent, guardian or teacher must also sign the entry form.**
- Deadline for all entries is **March 27, 2023.**
 - Entries must be emailed to lawday@pcbaonline.org
- Teachers may submit all their students' entries together.
